The excavations at Stanton Harcourt, as seen on Professor Alice Robert's "Digging for Britain" TV series, revealed a wealth of archaeology ranging from mesolithic through to WWII. The main focus of the site is a dense Iron Age occupation with around 1,700 storage pits. They also found an Anglo-Saxon settlement with 22 post-built timber buildings which might even be the original village of Stanton. Other finds and features include several Roman enclosures.
