

The forgotten island?

Recent archaeological work on Iron Age Alderney

Iron Age evidence in the Channel Islands traditionally focused on Guernsey and Jersey. Smaller islands, including Alderney have been largely excluded from investigation. A chance discovery of human skeletal remains in 2017 led to a series of excavations which shed new light on an intensive and important Iron Age occupation in Alderney. This lecture will present details of these discoveries and consider the wider implications for cross-Channel contact in the Iron Age.
