

In Search of the Catuvellauni: A Late Iron Age Tribe in a Roman Landscape

The origins of the Catuvellauni are an enigma, not mentioned by Julius Caesar and yet identifiable in the archaeological record. The tribe clearly grew in strength and territory in the aftermath of the Roman conquest, winning favour under the new Roman governors to become a regional administrative area with its centre at Verulamium. This presentation takes a closer look within the territory of the Catuvellauni, considering how the distinctive tribal landscape of the Iron Age transitioned into a Romano-British one and what changes this brought for the native population of the area.
